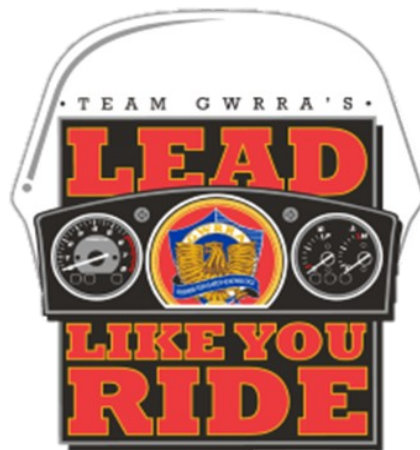

WHAT IF WE APPLIED THE SAME PRINCIPLES WE USE WHEN WE RIDE TO OUR LEADERSHIP OF THE ASSOCIATION?

We are demonstrating leadership every time we ride.
